

Waves of Nectar: Celebrating Sri Swamiji's Centenary Birth Anniversary at Rikhiapeeth


In the spirit of honoring the profound life and teachings of Paramahansa Swami Satyananda, Rikhiapeeth embarked on a year-long celebration throughout 2023, culminating in a grand tribute on the 100th birth anniversary of Sri Swamiji on the 26th of December. This jubilant occasion, known as "Amrit Lahari – Waves of Nectar", encapsulated the essence of Sri Swamiji's vision for Rikhiapeeth and embodied the principles of Serve, Love, and Give.

The events held at Rikhiapeeth were a testament to the enduring impact of Swami Satyananda's teachings. The festivities unfolded through a series of meaningful aradhanas ad seva projects aimed at benefiting both the local community and the spiritual aspirants who gathered from all conerns of the world

Among the events were medical camps organized for the villagers which provided essential healthcare services to those in need. This seva was aligned with Sri Swamiji's compassionate vision, emphasizing service to humanity as an integral aspect of spiritual practice.

Workshops were conducted for the kanyas (young girls) and batuks (young boys), fostering their holistic development. These workshops served as platforms for nurturing talents and imparting valuable life skills. A special highlight were the regular bhoj conducted for kanyas and batuks.

The year-long celebration also included various aradhanas and sadhana retreats, providing spiritual seekers with the opportunity to delve deeper into their inner selves and connect with the divine, following the path illuminated by Sri Swamiji.



A Spiritual Tribute

Swami Satyasangananda's Ashtottarshatlaksh Mantra Purashcharana

At Rikhiapeeth, Peethadhishwari Swami Satyasangananda undertook the sankalpa of Ashtottarshatlaksh Mantra Purashcharana, from 14th January 2023. This sankalpa took nine months to complete and was undertaken to honor the tradition established by Paramahansa Satyananda who performed this sadhana at Rikhiapeeth in 1992, and to honour his spiritual legacy.

The undertaking of Ashtottarshatlaksh Mantra Purashcharana stood as a testament to Swami Satyasangananda's devotion, surrender and commitment to continuing the traditions established by Paramahansa Satyananda and to offer homage and reverence to Guru. This sadhana created a channel through which the spiritual teachings and energy of Swami Satyananda continued to flow.

The significance of this sadhana was elevated as it was an offering to Swami Satyananda as a part of 'Amrit Lahari', the year-long tribute conducted at Rikhiapeeth in honour of his 100th birth anniversary. This commemorative period not only served as an intense period of remembrance, seva and aradhanas, but also as a time dedicated for spiritual practices, with the Ashtottarshatlaksh Mantra Purashcharana at its zenith.

At the culmination of this anusthan, Swami Satyasangananda offered 11 lakh ahuti. This involved offering sacred oblations into the fire for up to 8 hours a day, and it symbolized profound surrender and gratitude and surrender to the Guru, to the divine cosmic forces, and to the spiritual journey itself. The 11 lakh ahuti acted as a sublime crescendo, an offering of love and reverence that transcended the physical realm, reaching towards the spiritual realms where the presence of Swami Satyananda resonated.

Swami Satyasangananda's Ashtottarshatlaksh Mantra Purashcharana in 2023 was a spiritual tribute filled with devotion, tradition, and a deep-seated connection to the Guru. It stood as a guiding light, illuminating the path for seekers, a timeless tribute to the spiritual legacy of Swami Satyananda that continues to flow through the sacred place of his Tapobhumi, Rikhiapeeth.













Swami Satyasangananda Saraswati, fondly known as Swami Satsangi is the Peethadhishwari of Rikhiapeeth as appointed by Swami Satyananda. As the Peethadhishwari, she is dedicated to implementing Sri Swami Sivananda's three precepts of serve, love and give and works tirelessly for the material and spiritual upliftment of the local community.

Purashcharana Sadhana

Swami Satyananda Saraswati


My wish is that every breath should be permeated by my mantra. I do japa all the time. We breathe 21,600 times in 24 hours. That means 15 breaths every minute, 900 breaths every hour, so in 24 hours, it is 21,600 rounds of breath.

The same mantra which you have received from your Guru should also be heard within as an experience. That is possible, if you can merge your mind in the breath. So you should attune your mind with the breath, and synchronize the breath with mantra. A lot of energy is required for this sadhana, because after all, you need to go to the toilet. You need to have a little rest and to eat food. This is only possible when you can sit with your back straight and your mind constant for many hours at a stretch. I have come here for this purpose, because I do not think that life has any other meaning.

In 1992, I performed the ashtottarshatlaksh mantra purashcharana. I did not meet anybody that whole year. It took me three hundred days, from morning to evening, to complete ten million, eight hundred thousand rounds of japa. It was a great success. After completing the purashcharana, my body and mind were both healthy, and I heard the inner command, 'Love your neighbour as I have loved you. Provide for your neighbours as I have provided you'. This was a very beautiful commandment.


World is One Family



Makar Sankranti




Holi at Rikhiapeeth:

A Day of Color, Joy, and Sacred Celebration 8th March 2023



Traditional 'Holika Dahan' bonfire was conducted symbolizing the triumph of good over evil, infusing the air with a sense of purity and renewal.













Akshay Tritiya 21st - 23rd April 2023

To highlight the permanent nature of the akshay tithi during his tapasya at Rikhiapeeth Sri Swamiji performed many sadhanas and rituals on this day as well as establishing the tradition of 'giving' as an essential element of this auspicious day.







On this day prasad of clothes, utensils, grains and other household amenities were offered to the villagers of Rikhia and surrounding panchayats. Cows and oxen were also given to deserving recipients.





Selflessness - Not Selfishness

Swami Satyananda Saraswati

I came to Rikhia to retire and live quietly in solitude. I did not want to meet anyone, and even now I do not want to meet anyone. I realized that knowing the Self is necessary to keep oneself disciplined, without any craving for name and fame, or even for doing service and helping others. There is a difference between the feeling of service and the feeling of Self. The feeling of Self means Atmabhava, the sentiment of others being like one's own Self. If I am hurt I feel pain, that is natural, but do I also feel pain if you are hurt? Atmabhava means to feel the experience of others as my own experience. The sorrow and sufferings of others, the death of somebody unknown to me, the problems of families who are strangers to me, are all felt as my own. This is Atmabhava, not charity. Seeing everyone in oneself and oneself in everyone is the highest attainment of Vedanta.

Nobody thinks of going to the house of a poor man and lighting a lamp. Nobody thinks of visiting the have-nots. If a child is born in a poor family, at least go and give the child a crib. When a child is born in your own family you immediately think of a crib and there are elaborate preparations in anticipation. But when there is a new-born in someone else's family, all you do is give good wishes and greetings. If you only give good wishes and greetings to someone who is born today, that will not help him. Go to his house and give him a warm sweater, some tonic for the mother and some money.

This is a practical sadhana I am giving you. I do it and Swami Satsangi does it. One day she went out and Ramu, the mason, was making his way home. He called her and said, "I prayed to Devi at Sat Chandi for a child and see my wife has given birth to twins." So Swami Satsangi came and informed me. She said, "He is asking for names for his twins. What names would you suggest for them?" I said to her, "Forget about naming them. First give them a crib, give medicine, get a doctor, cut the umbilical cord. Treat the wound with antiseptic. A name you can give tomorrow or even in nine days. What is the urgency?"

Gods Mandate

Swami Satyananda Saraswati



On 8th of September, the birthday of my Guru, a question which was haunting my mind from time to time was answered. Where do I fulfil my next mission?

I could not decide where to stay. I had many options - one was Gurushikhar at Mount Abu, another was at Gangotri, where I was offered a cave, a kutir in Kedarnath. The swamis at my Guru's ashram also offered to keep me with them, and many others. Many people invited me, but I was unable to decide where I should go. So, I reserved my decision until the direction was made clear to me.

On 8th September, the birthday of Swami Sivanandaji, I woke at about two o'clock in the early morning, made a little tea, took my bath and sat down. The sky was quiet, the translucent rays of Ashtami were shining through the small windows of my kutir, and I found that I was once again enveloped by a strange light. There was total quiet and then there was a huge storm with lightning and thunder. This storm happened internally, not externally. My mind sank again. I gradually lost consciousness. At 4 am the shrill voice came saying: "Chitabhumao" - Go to my burial ground, the smashan bhoomi. The command was clear.

Chitabhumao means cremation ground. That was all, burial ground. Chita means burning of the body and bhumi means ground. At once, I understood the meaning of what I had heard. It was a clear instruction that I was to go to a cremation ground.

In India, in the Vedic mythology and in the Puranas, particularly in the Siva Purana, there are references to two cremation grounds. One is at Varanasi,

known as Siva's smashan bhumi. The other is this entire area of Deoghar which, in our scriptures, is referred to as Chitabhumao, which is considered to be the burial ground not of Siva but of Sati. Deoghar is the second tantric seat after Kamakhya, which is located in Guwahati, Assam.

When the voice uttered the word 'Chitabhumao', I also saw the property very clearly in a vision; the building, the trees, everything as clearly as on a television screen. There have been so many other instances which I have attributed to my super mind, higher mind, deeper mind, greater mind or whatever you wish to call it. But now I did not make that mistake. That was my God who guided me. He had guided me from childhood.

He gave His mandate and it was going to happen. I did not even worry about how it will happen. I had the feeling that I am a servant, I do not have to worry. I do not have to be anxious. If He gives me an order I will do it, then things become easy. The servant does not have to worry. He just has to carry out his orders. A servant has no accountability, no responsibility. He just has to do his duty and not think too much. Not only in the path of sadhana, but in life also, man has no choices.

So, I did not choose Rikhia. God gave me this place. I had never thought of this place. I did not leave the ashram and decide to come here by my own choice, nor am I doing anything by my own desire.



2023 has been a profoundly memorable year for Rikhiapeeth. Naturally, it witnessed numerous aradhanas, events, workshops, medical camps, and the training of kanyas and batuks—all aimed at highlighting Swami Satyananda's vision, wherein every human being should lead a life of dignity. Consequently, the entire year was dedicated to his teachings with and emphasis on "Serve, Love and Give" which is practiced and lived here at Rikhiapeeth. Embarking on the Ashtottarshatlaksh Mantra Purashcharana journey, I commenced on the 14th of January and concluded on the 4th of November. At the culmination, I performed the havan of eleven lakh ahuthis, offering swaha eleven lakh times into the sacred fire.



I contemplated acquiring a robot, but then I heard Swamiji's voice reassuring me, "No, you don't need a robot because you are the robot! You are doing it for me. You are my robot." Accepting this, I embraced the task, understanding that my operating system was not artificial intelligence but rather 'RI'—Real Intelligence.

I experienced that the sadhana gave a profoundly purifying impact on all the events at Rikhia, permeating the entire environment. Its conclusion coincided with another significant event: the Nav Nirman of the Samadhi - the installation of the Sri Yantra over the Samadhi Sthal and the unveiling of its new form, which I have named as the "Kaleidoscope Samadhi."




